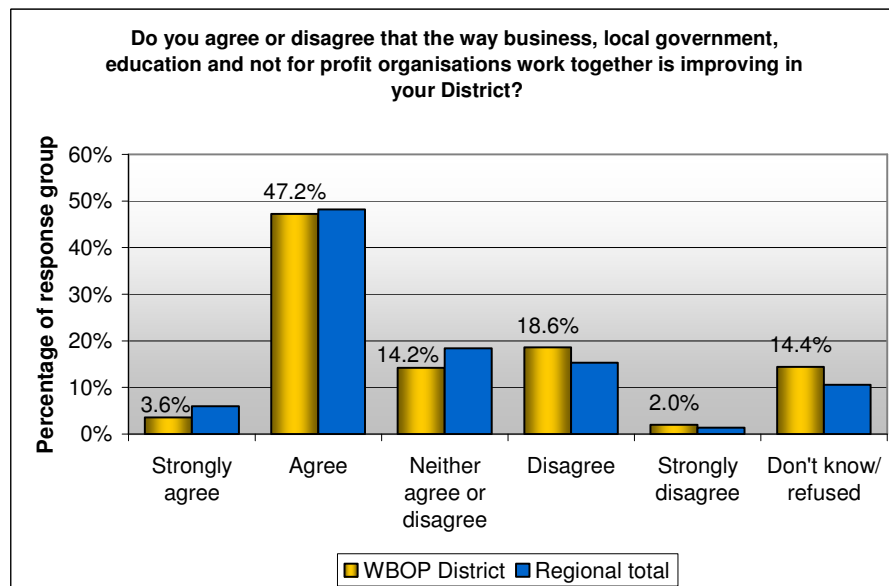
Leaders are effective, informed and inclusive

How we will measure this: Perception that leaders are getting better at working together

Why are we monitoring this?

The District benefits significantly from cooperative and collaborative leadership. More efficient and effective decisions can be made when leaders work together on issues, pooling ideas and resources, and ensuring that different organisations' decisions do not conflict. A major example of this collaboration is SmartGrowth, a 50-year growth management plan for the western Bay of Plenty sub-region and a parent plan for other plans relating to different aspects of the Community's future and wellbeing. Through the SmartGrowth planning process, and other opportunities, the public has been able to perceive how leaders have worked together.

What is this about?

A total of 500 people in the Western Bay of Plenty District were surveyed and asked "Do you agree or disagree that the way business, local government, education and not for profit organisations work together is improving in your District?"

Of those surveyed 50.8 percent agreed or strongly agreed and this is lower than the regional result of 54.2 percent. 20.6 percent disagreed or strongly disagreed, this is much higher than the regional result of 16.7 percent.

How will we know we are successful?

Service providers work together to coordinate planning and delivery of service.
