General Bylaw 2008

Authority

This Bylaw is made under the Local Government Act 2002 and all other enactments enabling the Western Bay of Plenty District Council in that behalf to make this Bylaw.

Title

This Bylaw is called the Western Bay of Plenty District Council General Bylaw 2008, and comes into force on 1 July 2008.

Repeal

The Western Bay of Plenty District Council General Bylaw 2001 is repealed.

Application

Except as expressly provided, this Bylaw applies to the whole of the Western Bay of Plenty District.

Scope

The objective of this Bylaw is to promote good rule and government within the Western Bay of Plenty District.

Works and activities regulated by the Resource Management Act 1991, or any other enactment, must be authorised pursuant to the provisions of those enactments before the works and activities can be carried out notwithstanding any approval given by Council under the Local Government Act 1974, the Local Government Act 2002, or this or any other bylaw.

Savings

All approvals, permits, and other acts of authority (including any resolutions of the Council) which originated under the Western Bay of Plenty District Council General Bylaw 2001 repealed by this Bylaw, and all applications, and other acts of parties and generally all documents, matters, acts, and things which so originated and are continuing at the commencement of this Bylaw, continue for the purposes of this Bylaw to have full force and effect.

The repeal of the Western Bay of Plenty District Council General Bylaw 2001 does not prevent any legal proceedings, criminal or civil, being taken to enforce those bylaws and such legal proceedings continue to be dealt with and completed as if that Bylaw had not been repealed.

Definition

The definition of certain words used in this Bylaw are set out in the Introduction Chapter (Chapter 1) of this Bylaw.

Making of this Bylaw

The initial resolution to make this bylaw was passed by the Western Bay of Plenty District Council at a meeting of the Council held on 1 May 2008 and was confirmed following consideration of submissions received during the special consultative procedure, by a resolution of the Council at a subsequent meeting of the Council held on 26 June 2008.
