

## Renewal of Club Licence

*Section 21 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **TE PUKE SPORTS AND RECREATION CLUB INCORPORATED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **ATUAROA AVENUE, TE PUKE** and known as **TE PUKE SPORTS AND RECREATION CLUB INCORPORATED** for consumption on the premises, to any person who –

- (a) is a member of the club; or
- (b) is on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or
- (c) is a member of some other club with which the holder of the licence has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with subpart 7 of part 2 of the Act.

### **CONDITIONS**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

4. While the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol no BYO alcohol may be consumed on the premises.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
6. At all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol a range of substantive food must be readily available. A minimum of three types of food should be available. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
8. The licensee must display:
  - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
  - b. A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by persons using the premises.


### **DURATION**

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or

**Friday: Hours: 5.00 pm to 12.00 Midnight.**

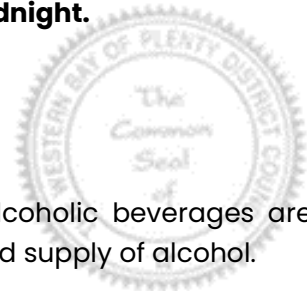
**Saturday and public holidays: Hours: 12.00 Midday to 12.00 Midnight.**

**Sunday: Hours: 12.00 Midday to 10.00 pm.**

**No changes are sought.**

A good list of substantive food options and low and non-alcoholic beverages are available at all times when the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol.

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health has raised any matters in opposition.



## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The principal activity is sport and associated socialising and the inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been reduced by more than a minor extent.

We have not imposed a condition requiring a certificated manager to be on duty whenever the bar is open. However, we would expect one of the Club Managers to be on duty at least on the busy days and for tournaments.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

We consider the renewal on the papers and refresh the licence conditions to reflect best practice.

## **DECISION**

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **approves** an application by **Te Puke Sports & Recreation Club Incorporated** for a renewal of the Club Licence in respect of premises situated at 50 Atuaroa Avenue, Te Puke subject to conditions.

The general nature of the business undertaken is that of a grocery store and meets the criteria of section 32(1) (f) of the Act. The applicant company and has been trading since 13 January 2006 with an off-licence at its current location.

The entire premises is undesignated and consists of five main aisles with the principal entrance on the right-hand-side of the store with the Single Alcohol Area (SAA) on the left-hand-side.

The current days and hours of operation are **Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 10.00pm**. These hours are within the operative Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy as it pertains to off-licensed grocery stores

No changes to the existing authorised days and hours are being sought.

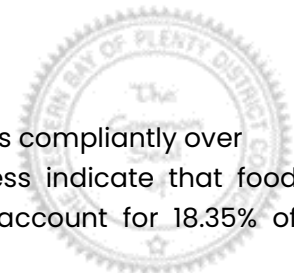
**Public Notification**

The application was notified in the Hauraki Coromandel Post edition of the Bay of Plenty Times on the 25<sup>th</sup> of November and again on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December 2021. No objections from the public were received by the secretariat.

**REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The Inspector reports that the applicant has operated this premises compliantly over the last period of renewal. Annual sales figures for the business indicate that food products is the principal business (53.32%) and alcohol sales account for 18.35% of business.

He also advises that the amenity and good order of the locality has not been reduced by more than a minor extent.



Neither the Police, nor the Medical Officer of Health, have raised any matters in opposition.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

We also refresh the licence conditions to reflect best practice.

**THE APPLICATION**

This is an application by **Telfords Yard Limited** for renewal of an **Off licence** in respect of premises situated at **41 Main Road, Katikati**, known as **Super Liquor Katikati**.

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a **Off licence – Bottle Store**.

The business is a bottle store where the principal business is the sale of alcohol and meets the criteria of s.32(1)(b) of the Act where more than 85% of the annual sales revenue is earned from the sale of alcohol for consumption somewhere else. The most recent annual sales figures provided by the applicant indicate that 87.63% of the sales revenue is derived from the sale of alcohol, indicating that the applicant satisfies the criteria.

The applicant is a limited private company incorporated on 10 November 2010 and has been trading since 18 January 2018 in the current location after moving from a previous site where they operated since 2011. This is the applicant's third renewal application.

The current days and hours of operation are:

**Monday to Sunday**                      **9:00 am**                      **to**                      **10:00 pm**

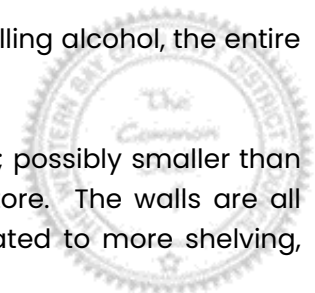
These hours are within the operative Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy as it relates to off-licensed bottle stores.

As the premises is a bottle store where the principal business is selling alcohol, the entire premises is designated as a Supervised Area.

The Inspector reports that the premises is a standard bottle store; possibly smaller than most. The counter is on the right-hand side as you enter the store. The walls are all converted to shelving and what little floor space there is dedicated to more shelving, housing more bottles of either spirits or wine.

No changes to the existing licence conditions are sought.

**Public Notification**



The application was publicly notified in the Katikati Advertiser version of the Bay of Plenty Times on the 18th and 25<sup>th</sup> of November 2021. No objections to the application were received by the secretariat.

### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

No additional information has come to light to indicate the sale or supply of alcohol has not been managed appropriately or for that matter how the applicant has displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.

The Inspector reports that there is no reason to believe the amenity and good order of the locality would likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

Neither the Police, nor the Medical Officer of Health have raised any matters in opposition to the application.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

This application submitted by the Bowentown Boating and Sport Fishing Club Incorporated (known as Bowentown Boating and Sport Fishing Club), located at 26 Pios Road, Bowentown, RDI Katikati, seeks a Special Licence to host one event: a Wedding Celebration to take place on Saturday 19 March 2022 from 6.00 pm to 10.30 pm.

The Club currently operates under Club Licence Renc1 022/6919/2017.

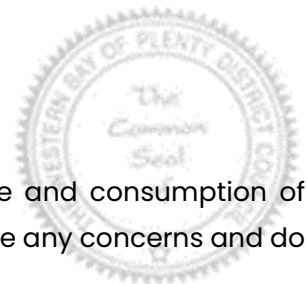
The application advises:

- That up to 60 people are expected to attend this event. The age range expected is between 27 to 70 years old and substantial food, water, low and non-alcoholic drinks will be available from the moment the event commences.
- The applicant has appointed a certificated duty manager Eda Pihe 022/Cert/7834/2020 to oversee the sale and consumption of alcohol.
- Transport options have been considered and are available – the club has a free courtesy van. I am aware that the courtesy van is regularly utilised.
- A one drink maximum per serve is being proposed by the applicant.

**Reasons for the Decision**
