Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the **Act**), **DSHS FOOD LIMITED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **4 THE ESPLANADE**, **OMOKOROA** and known as **BEACHED ON BLUE**, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 1.00am the following day;

Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted;
- 6. A properly appointed certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises;
- 7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
- 8. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale or alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

The Application

DSHA Food Limited ("the licensee") applies for a new ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 4 The Esplanade, Omokoroa known as "Beached on Blue."

The application come about following a change of ownership. They currently trade under a Temporary Authority.

The business is a restaurant/cafe where the provision of food will be the principal source of sales revenue.

The application was notified in the Bay of Plenty Times on the 20th and 27th of July 2019 and no objections were received from members of the public.

The days and hours sought are **Monday to Sunday 9.60am to 1.00am the following day.** These hours are within with the Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy.

The applicant has provided a detailed menu of the food options they intend to sell and the low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments that are available.

The food is prepared on site and the inspector is satisfied that it is of an acceptable variety and price range and that a range of food offered can be provided within a reasonable time of placing an order.

A Building and Planning Certificate has been sought and issued showing the activity meets Town Planning requirements and those of the Building Code.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The application has received supportive reports from the Inspector and the Police. The Medical Officer of Health also has no matters in opposition.

The inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area is unlikely to be adversely affected by more than a minor extent and that the applicant has sound host responsibility practices.

The first year of a new licence is often called the 'probationary year' and no doubt the regulatory agencies will monitor the licence from time to time.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 & 106 of the Act.

We consider the application on the papers.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, grants an application by DSHA Food Limited ("the licensee") for a new ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 4 The Esplanade, Omokoroa known as "Beached on Blue" subject to conditions.

The premises are as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 17 July 2019. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

The Application

Amit Kooner Limited applies for renewal of an OFF Licence in respect of premises situated at 155A Jellicoe Street, Te Puke known as "Te Puke Liquor Spot."

The business is a franchised bottle store and meets the criteria of s.32(1)(b) of the Act in that it is retail premises from which more than 85% of the annual sales revenue is earned from the sale of alcohol for consumption somewhere else.

The entire premises is designated as a Supervised Area.

The current days and hours of operation are: **Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 10.00pm.** These hours are within the default national maximum trading hours and the operative Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy as it pertains to off-licensed bottle stores.

No changes are sought.

Public Notification:

The application was notified in the Te Puke Times on the 7th and 14th of February 2019. No objections from the public were received by the secretariat.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Inspector reports that the applicant has operated this bottle store complex compliantly over the renewal period other than one incident in November 2017 where they sold alcohol to an intoxicated person. This resulted in a holding being imposed by ARLA in November 2018 and the licence was suspended from trading for 24 hours.

Neither the Police, nor the Medical Officer of Health, raise any matters in opposition.

The Inspector initially opposed the renewal and the matter was to be set down for a public hearing. This was due to issues around a group of hardened street drinkers and rough sleepers in the town that were breaching the town alcohol ban and creating litter and disorder.

This coupled with the illegal sale of alcohol to an intoxicated person by the staff of Te Puke Liquor Spot late in 2017 tipped the balance for the Inspector and he recommended the renewal be considered in a public hearing.

Subsequently in July 2019 the District Licensing Committee held a public hearing into the renewal in another bottle store in the township.

The evidence presented to the Committee showed that this group of street drinkers appeared to have easy access to alcohol from the town's outlets and were causing significant harm to themselves and others. One member of that group has since been found dead in a backstreet after a heavy drinking session.

As a result of that hearing the agencies and the Committee have drawn a deep line in the sand. In our decision for HB Enterprises Limited 22/RENOFF/7445/2019 we said:

90. However, it was pleasing to see the commitment coming forward now from the agencies and the applicant to tackle the issue. Without overstating it, it is sad that it has taken a tragic and foreseeable death, and a renewal of licence, to galvanise the applicant into action.

- 91. We intend to impose a suite of conditions on the renewal that will steer the applicant in the right direction. We expect them to go door knocking, if they haven't already done so, to the other off-licensed premises in town and asking them to come on board and voluntarily adopt the discretionary conditions we intend to apply on this licence and to become actively involved in the Off-Licence Alcohol Accord.
- 92. Some of the measures may upset some 'good' customers, but we say this, sometimes we all might have to accept a little inconvenience in our lives for the greater good of the community. Alcohol is no ordinary commodity. Selling and supplying alcohol comes with serious responsibilities. It is not 'just about operating a business.'
- 93. We are not happy with the prominent position that Kingfisher Strong is displayed in this store. Its current positioning is in a prime location. We would prefer the applicant not to stock this product, or similar items of single serve 500ml high alcohol percentage beverages. If they are to be stocked, they should be placed in a low-profile display area in the store and each can is to have an indelible black line drawn across the bottom of the can prior to being placed on sale.
- 94. Once the other bottle stores and the supermarkets are on board, they will be required to place 2, 3, 4 or 5 black lines on the bottom of the cans. These will be coded back to the store and if found dumped in the reserve or the CBD will give a clear indicator back to the source store. This information should not be used for punitive action but will indicate where additional resources and measures may need to be directed.
- 95. However, should sale and supply issues continue to arise from, or in, the vicinity of this premises we would expect to see firm enforcement action undertaken by the agencies. Shoulder-tap purchases by members of the public who buy alcohol for banned people must be dealt with firmly. The agencies can set up a mini-operation and catch a few such purchasers and make an issue about it by charging them with the offence of supplying an intoxicated person and/or trespassing them from the off-licensed accord members premises.

We are pleased to see that this applicant has embraced the need for discretionary conditions and by consent they will be applied. For Te Puke Liquor Spot this means there must be no single serves of mainstream beers or RTDs and if products such as Godfather or Kingfisher Strong are sold, they are to be indelibly marked as discussed above.

The commitment and co-operation form the applicant has been sufficient for the Inspector to withdraw his opposition to the renewal and he invites the Committee to consider the renewal on the papers.

Whilst the Inspector and the MOoH believe that the amenity and good order of the locality has been reduced by more than a minor extent it cannot be definitively laid at the door of Te Puke Liquor Spot.

Collectively the off-licensed outlets of Te Puke must step up and restrict the sales of alcohol to the street drinkers and to those that on-supply to them.

We are concerned to hear from the Inspector about the lack of visibility through the front windows and the abusive language observed from a customer who was being denied alcohol because of their state of intoxication.

We are not privy to the details of the incident, but we suspect that that individual should have been challenged prior to approaching the counter with alcohol as it is an offence to allow an intoxication person to enter, and/or remain, on licensed premises. Similarly, we hope that the licensee is actively addressing the visibility issues as it is a health and safety issue for their employees and potentially a deterrent to aggressors if their actions and language is in plain view of passerby's.

We hope that a formal complaint was lodged with the Police and the abusive person identified and banned from the store.

Decisive action is required by all sectors of the equation to bring about a positive change to the CBD of Te Puke township.

Subject to the above, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

We refresh the licence conditions to reflect best practice and to accommodate the new discretionary conditions.

 - fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - d. grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - e. a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted;
- 4. While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons at no cost from a water supply prominently situated on the premises;
- 5. A properly appointed Certificated, or Acting or Temporary, Manager must be on duty, at or nearby the point of sale, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- 6. There is to be no single sales of mainstream beers under 500mls and/or those not intended by the manufacturer to be sold as single serves.
- 7. All cans of high alcohol (over 6% abv) beverages 500ml or over are to be marked with a number 3 on the bottom of the can. This condition does not apply to craft beer;
- 8. The Licensee must display signage as follows:

The Application

This is an application by **Jayson Holdings Limited** for the renewal and variation of an OFF Licence in respect of premises situated at 137 Jellicoe Street, Te Puke, known as "**Te Puke Four Square & Lotto**.

The applicant has been operating this store for 14 months

The current days and hours are: Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 10.00 pm. No changes are sought.

These are within the default national maximum trading hours for off licenses of 7am to 11pm and within the adopted Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy.

The business is a medium-sized open-plan store with shelves and aisles holding food products and other household goods on all sides and a single alcohol area (SAA) in one corner of the store.

The application was notified in the Te Puke Times on the 23rd and 30th of May 2019 and no objections were received from members of the public.

The applicant has submitted sales figures for the 12 months period immediately prior to lodging the application that indicate that the principal activity is the sale of food products.

The Police do not oppose the renewal. The Medical Officer of Health initially opposed the renewal believing the SSA was non-compliant. They have since been satisfied that the newly redefined Single Alcohol Area is now compliant.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The application is complete and contains all the necessary considerations as required under s.127 of the Act. It was duly advertised, and no public objections were received.

The agencies appear to be satisfied that this business is a grocery store and that the amenity and good order of the area has not been adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

We remind the applicant that the annual sales figures MUST be verified as correct by an accountant according to prepared accounts. We expect Regulation 12(1)(c) to be complied with fully at next renewal.

Subject to the above the Committee is satisfied that the business is that of a grocery store.

The redefined SAA is clearly displayed on the new plan dated 29 July 2019.

In July 2019 the Committee conducted a public hearing into the renewal of the Te Puke Bottle-O.

In approving the renewal, we made it clear that collectively the off-licensed outlets in Te Puke needed to step up and restrict the supply of alcohol to a group of hardened street drinkers.

In that decision we applied a number of discretionary conditions to the renewal and we said:

92. Some of the measures may upset some 'good' customers, but we say this, sometimes we all might have to accept a little inconvenience in our lives for the greater good of the community. Alcohol is no ordinary commodity Selling and supplying alcohol comes with serious responsibilities. It is not 'just about operating a business.'

- 93. We are not happy with the prominent position that Kingfisher Strong is displayed in this store. Its current positioning is in a prime location. We would prefer the applicant not to stock this product, or similar items of single serve 500ml high alcohol percentage beverages. If they are to be stocked, they should be placed in a low-profile display area in the store and each can is to have an indelible black line drawn across the bottom of the can prior to being placed on sale.

The agencies can set up a mini-operation and catch a few such purchasers and make an issue about it by charging them with the offence of supplying an intoxicated person and/or trespassing them from the off-licensed accord members premises.

We are pleased to see that this applicant has embraced the need for discretionary conditions and by consent they will be applied. For Te Puke Four Square this means there must be no single serves of mainstream beers and if products such as Godfather or Kingfisher Strong are sold, they are to be indelibly marked as discussed above.

We have modified the conditions slightly as grocery stores can only sell beer and wine.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.120 and 131 and s.112-115 of the Act.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

- 8. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point of sale signage detailing the restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principle entrance to the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
- 9. The "single alcohol area" for the premises is as described on the plan dated **29 July 2019** and attached at Appendix 'A' to the licence. The licensee must ensure that:

- 4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
- 5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcoholibeverages;
- 6. The Licensee must display signage as follows: 341
 - a. At every point of sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;

- b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
- c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty;
- 7. The licensee must provide information and advice about forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
- 8. No BYO alcohol is to be brought into the event.
