The Application

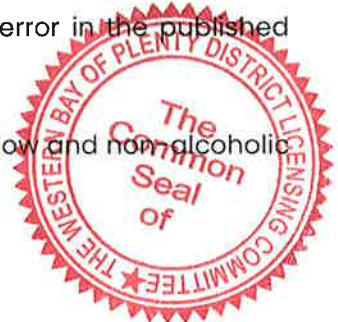
Bevin Limited applies for the renewal of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 22 Wilson Road, Waihi Beach, known as "La Vie en Rose Waihi Beach."

The business is a Class 1 restaurant/café. The current licensed hours are **Monday to Sunday 4.00pm to 11.30pm. No changes are sought.**

These hours fit within both the default national maximum trading hours for ON Licences, and the Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy.

The application was publicly notified on councils website from the 6th of November 2025, and no objections were received by the DLC Secretariat from members of the public. As a matter of completeness, I grant a waiver for the error in the published hours that were greater than those actually sought..

The applicant has provided a comprehensive tapas menu and low and non-alcoholic beverages available on the premises.



Reasons for the Decision

The applicant has operated this licence for several years and has not come to adverse notice in recent times.

Neither the Police, nor the Medical Officer of Health, has raised any matters in opposition.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s131 of the Act.

Accordingly, I will determine the matter on the papers.

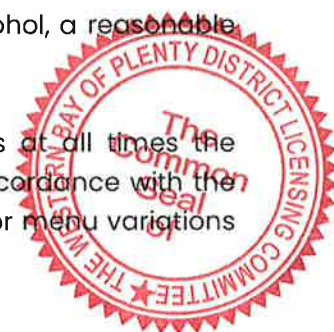

4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations



of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted;

5. A properly appointed certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises;
6. The licensee must provide information, advice, and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
7. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol.
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

The renewal will be for three (3) years from the expiry of the current licence, and a replacement licence is to be issued.
