THE APPLICATION

This application, submitted by **A&K 2024 LIMITED**, seeks a **ON LICENCE** in respect of premises situated at **4 TE PUNA ROAD, TAURANGA**, trading as **NOURISH CAFE**. The general nature of the business undertaken is that of an **ON LICENCE - CLASS 3 RESTAURANT**. The principal entrance is accessed from the shared car parking off Te Puna Road.

The applicant is a private limited company, incorporated on 17 September 2024. The premises was sold in late December 2024 to the applicant. There was an on-licence held for this premises (022/RENON/8548/2022), which expired on 26 May 2025. Avinash Sunil Sharma and Krishna Sharma are the two directors and equal shareholders of the applicant company. Krishna Sharma has worked in the alcohol industry, working in bottle stores and managing a restaurant in Tauranga. Krishna holds a manager's certificates issued by the Tauranga District Licensing Committee.

As the applicant still intends to continue to operate the premises as a café/restaurant, selling alcohol for consumption on the premises this On Licence is now sought. The primary nature of the business will continue to be the sale of food with alcohol being made available when accompanied with a meal.

The criteria for the issuing of this licence are found under section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act).

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The application was publicly notified on the Western Bay of Plenty District Council website for 25 working days to allow the public time to object to the application, as per Section 102 of the Act. No objections were raised during that period.

The application was unopposed by both the reporting agencies, and no public objections were received. However, the MOoH offered the following recommendation:
a minimum of three types of Low alcohol and 0% alcohol beers/ciders/ RTDs be made available and recommends having a minimum of three duty managers.

At an inspection on 27 June 2025, The Inspector met with Krishna Sharma and reports that she had a good understanding of her responsibilities and requirements under the Act,



No concerns have been raised regarding the applicant's suitability or the current operation of the premise. Thereby the Inspector has raised no grounds to question the applicant's suitability at this point in time. The Inspector considers the applicant to be suitable and their proposal for the sale and supply of alcohol is consistent with the Act's purpose and meets the section 105 criteria.

A planning and building certificate was not attached with the application. The applicant has recently applied for this certificate and is awaiting approval from Council's Building and Planning teams.

The inspector has no concerns with the design and layout of the premises. The applicant intends to only serve alcohol to customers when seated. The applicant has requested the entire premises to be included in the licensed area. The licensed area is defined on the plan date stamped as received by Western Bay of Plenty District Council on 04 June 2025. This premises does not require a designation as the principal business is providing meals.

Alongside food and alcohol, the applicant also runs a small gift shop inside the premises.

When the inspector conducted a site inspection the premises was open, and customers were present. A discussion was had regarding, required signage, free water, non-alcoholic options, low-alcoholic options, food, and host responsibility. At that time Krishna appeared to be well aware of his responsibilities and had planned and prepared to have the appropriate systems in place to comply with an on-licence.

The premises is situated at 4 Te Puna Road, Te Puna, in a shared shopping centre, is accessed from a shared carpark and is located in a commercially zoned and there is no alcohol ban in place for this area.

The following licenced premises are located in close proximity to the premises:

- Bottle Craft Te Puna – Off licence bottle store.
- Te Puna Liquor Centre – Off licence bottle store
- White House Restaurant – On licence restaurant
- Te Puna Sports Bar & Orchard Thieves Pizza – On Licence tavern
- Te Puna Four Square – Off Licence grocery store

The premises is clean, presentable and in keeping with the local area. The applicant has been operating the business since December 2024, and no concerns relating to noise, nuisance or vandalism relating to the premises have been raised. During the site-inspection the inspector reports there was no visual evidence of anti-social behaviour such as discarded bottles, cans, or litter to indicate the outside area is being used to pre-load. There is no information to suggest the premises is associated with any criminal behaviour.

The hours sought are within the hours permitted under the local alcohol policy and are the same as the substantive on-licence held for the premises.



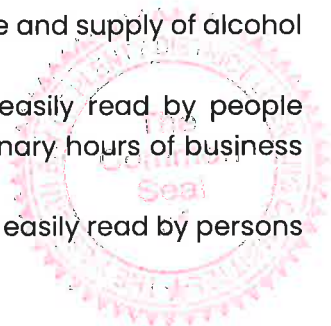
After conducting due diligence on the application and applicant the inspector reports that there is nothing to suggest that the granting of this licence application would not achieve the object of the Act.

THE DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, thereby grants a Class 3 On Licence to **A&K 2024 Limited, trading as Nourish Café** ; in respect to premises located at 4 Te Puna Road, RD4 Tauranga; subject to the following conditions.

The Mandatory Conditions to be applied at all times.

1. Alcohol may only be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:
Monday to Sunday: 9:00 am to 1:00 am the following day.
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine,
3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises,
4. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all time when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages ($\leq 2.5\%$ abv).
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
6. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises,
7. The Licensee must provide information, advice, and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
8. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

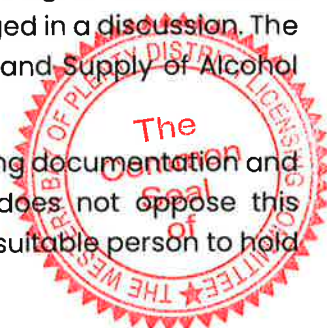
The Reasons for the Decision

The applicant, SG Hoticulture Enterprises Limited has already taken over the business and plans to open once a TA and the appropriate food licence has been issued.



An email has been provided to the DLC alongside the application detailing additional information from the applicant regarding their experience and business plan.

Reasons for the Decision

The Police have reported on the application with no matters in opposition.

The Inspector does not oppose this application.

The application and supporting information provided to date satisfies the District Licensing Committee in respect of s.136 of the Act for the granting of a Temporary Authority.

The Decision

This, the 1st Temporary Authority, issued to SG Horticulure Enterprises Limited shall be valid until the substantive Licence application lodged by SG Horticulure Enterprises Limited is determined or until the 13th of September 2025.

The Condition to be Applied
