The Application

Dolce Café & Bar Limited applies for the grant of an ON Licence in respect of premises situated at Unit 7, 30 Main Road, Katikati to be known as **"Dolce Café & Bar."**

The business is to be a low-risk Class 3 cafe/bar. The licensed days and hours sought are **Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 12.00 midnight.**

These hours fit within both the default national maximum trading hours and the Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy.

The application was publicly on council's website from the 13th of November 2024. No objections were received by the DLC Secretariat from members of the public.

The applicant has provided a menu of the food options and low and non-alcoholic beverages that will be available on the premises.

Reasons for the Decision

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health has raised any matters in opposition.

The inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area should not be reduced by more than a minor extent by this low-risk activity.



As a Class 3 restaurant, alcohol can only be supplied as part of a meal during table serve.

We also note that there is only one certificated manager appointed to the business. This is insufficient for the hours sought. Alcohol can only be sold and supplied when a certificated manager is on duty.

Acting and Temporary manager appointments cannot be used to fill the gaps.

The onus is clearly on the applicant to ensure that the provisions of the Act are met at all times.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s105 – 106 of the Act.

Subject to the above, I will determine the matter on the papers.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **grants** an application by **Dolce Café & Bar Limited** for an ON Licence in respect of premises situated at Unit 7, 30 Main Road, Katikati to be known as **“Dolce Café & Bar”** subject to conditions.

Conditions:

The ON licence is subject to the conditions listed below:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday from 9:00am to 12.00 midnight;**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine;
3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.



4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted;
6. A properly appointed certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises;
7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
8. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

The licence is granted for 12 months from the date of issue.

THE APPLICATION

This is an application by **Graduate Enterprises Limited** for the renewal of an **OFF LICENCE** in respect of premises situated at **33 Wilson Road, Waihi Beach** known as **Waihi Beach Four Square**.

The general nature of the business undertaken is that of an Off Licence grocery store and meets the criteria of section 32(1)(f) of the Act. The applicant has provided verified annual sales revenue figures that indicate that the principal purpose of the business is the sale of food products.

The Inspector reports that the applicant company and has been trading for several years with no known issues and that this is their eighth renewal application.

The entire premises is one large rectangular shaped room and has five aisles that extend to the rear of the store. Products line the shelves and the surrounding walls. The Single Alcohol Area (SAA) is situated on the left-hand side of the store and is observable from the checkout area.

The current days and hours of operation are **Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 9.00pm**. These hours are within the operative Local Alcohol Policy as it pertains to off-licensed grocery stores.

No changes to the existing authorised days and hours are being sought.

Public Notification

The application was notified in the Western Bay of Plenty District Council website on 26 November 2024. No objections from the public were received by the secretariat within the statutory time frame.



REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Inspector reports that the applicant has operated this premises compliantly during the last period of renewal. Annual sales figures for the business indicate that food products are the principal income of the business.

The Inspector also advises that there is no evidence to question the applicant's suitability and is satisfied that the premises are compliant with the Act. There are no concerns with the design and layout of the premises and the single alcohol area has not changed from the last renewal.

Neither the Police, the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector have opposed the application.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

We also refresh the licence conditions to reflect best practice.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 approves an application by **Graduate Enterprises Limited** for a renewal of an OFF Licence in respect of premises situated at **33 Wilson Road, Waihi Beach** known as "**Waihi Beach Four Square**" subject to conditions.

Conditions

The licence is subject to the conditions listed below:

1. Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:

Monday to Sunday - 7:00 am to 9:00 pm

2. No alcohol is to be sold on, or delivered from, the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day.
3. While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at the place where the samples are being supplied.
4. **A properly appointed Certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty, at or nearby the point of sale, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.**



5. The Licensee must display:

- (i) At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
- (ii) At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol.
- (iii) A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance.

6. No alcohol may be sold other than:

- (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
- (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
- (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
- (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
- (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.

7. The "single alcohol area" for the premises is as described on the plan dated **19 November 2024** and attached at Appendix 'A' to the licence. The licensee must ensure that:

- a. No alcohol is displayed, promoted, or advertised outside the single alcohol area; and
- b. No products other than alcohol, low-alcohol and non-alcoholic beer, wine or mead are displayed, promoted, or advertised inside the single alcohol area.

THE APPLICATION

This is an application by **Telfords Yard Limited** for renewal of an **Off licence** in respect of premises situated at **41 Main Road, Katikati**, known as **Super Liquor Katikati**.

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a **Off licence – Bottle Store**.

The business is a bottle store where the principal business is the sale of alcohol and meets the criteria of s.32(1)(b) of the Act where more than 88.56% of the annual sales revenue is earned from the sale of alcohol for consumption somewhere else.

The applicant is a limited private company incorporated on 10 November 2010 with Dipan Jamnadas, Mahesh Jamnadas and Neha Jamnadas being directors. The stated shareholders are: Sartor Limited, Neha Jamnadas and Sunil Bhikha. This is the applicant's seventh renewal application.

The current days and hours of operation are:

Monday to Sunday 9:00am to 9:00pm

No changes are sought to the existing authorised hours. The current Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) stipulates maximum trading hours of 7.00 am to 9.00 pm. Therefore, the existing trading hours are within those stipulated under the LAP.

As the premises is a bottle store where the principal business is selling alcohol, the entire premises is designated as a Supervised Area.

The Inspector reports that the premises are a generic bottle store layout and is well kept with a tidy appearance. There are no concerns over the way that the premises has been conducted under the current existing licence.



Public Notification

The application was publicly notified on the Western Bay of Plenty District Council website on 30 November 2024. No objections to the application were received by the secretariat.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

No additional information has come to light to indicate the sale or supply of alcohol has not been managed appropriately or for that matter how the applicant has displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.

The Inspector reports that there is no reason to believe the amenity and good order of the locality would likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

The Police have raised no matters in opposition.

The Medical Officer of Health have not reported on this application. As per section 103(4) of the Act the DLC is entitled to assume that there are no matters in opposition.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chair, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **approves** the application by **Telfords Yard Limited** for renewal of an Off-licence in respect of premises situated at **41 Main Road, Katikati** known as **"Super Liquor Katikati"**, subject to conditions.

Conditions

The licence is subject to the conditions listed as follows:

1. Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

THE APPLICATION

This is an application by **Bay of Plenty Clay Target Association Incorporated** for the renewal of a **Club Licence** in respect of premises situated at **Te Aro-O-Raho, TECT All Terrain Park** known as the **Bay of Plenty Clay Target Association.**

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a **Club Licence – Class 2.**

The applicant is an incorporated society and was incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 on 3 November 2010. This is the applicant's fourth application since 2018.

The application was publicly notified on the Western Bay of Plenty District website on 22 November 2024. No objections were received from members of the public within the prescribed time frame. The Inspector has reported that there two minor errors in the public notification. The first was that the notification was made just outside the legislative time frame and that the second was that the club was described as a class 3 when it should have been a class 2. The Inspector requests that a waiver be granted under s.208 as the errors were minor and that the public has not been significantly disadvantaged. I agree, the waiver is granted.

No changes are sought to the existing authorised hours which are:

Monday to Sunday 12:00 noon to 9:00 pm

These hours are within the operative Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy as it relates to Club Licences.



The applicant has supplied a list of food options as well as low and non-alcoholic beverages that are available when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.

Neither the Medical Officer of Health nor the Police have raised no matters in opposition.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The premises is a clay target gun club with a club room and gun range. The club is situated within the TECT All Terrain Park, off Pyes Pa Road (State Highway 36).

The club house consists of a bar area, kitchen, inside seating area, toilet facilities, office and storeroom. There is also an external decked area. The applicant has requested that a small patio area also be included in the licensed area, the Inspector supports this minor addition.

The principal entrance is accessed from a carpark which is accessed from Te Aro-O-Raho Road. The licensed area is more precisely identified on the plan date stamped as received by Western Bay of Plenty District Council on 30 October 2024.

The applicant is a member of NZCTA, where all member clubs share reciprocal rights.

The Inspector has reported she has received no complaints regarding the club activities or the actions of its members. In addition, the Inspector reports that to date, no issues have been identified with the operation of the premises in accordance with the object of the Act.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chair, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **approves** the application by the **Bay of Plenty Clay Target Association Incorporated** for renewal of the Club-licence in respect of premises situated at **Te Aro-O-Raho, TECT All Terrain Park** and known as the **"Bay of Plenty Clay Target Association"**, subject to conditions.

Conditions

TE PUKE CITIZENS CLUB INC is seeking a Class 3 On-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at **179 JELICOE STREET, TE PUKE, 3119**; known as **CITIZENS RSA TE PUKE**, to enable it to facilitate the Tridents Woman's Flag Football Quiz Night Fundraiser on Saturday 08 March 2025 from 5:30 pm to 10:00 pm.

THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

All agencies including the Inspector have reported with no matters in opposition to the application. The event is of a small size (approx. 80 – 90 attendees), public, not by invitation only, and not ticketed.

Drinks per person per transaction has been limited to two.

The club vans will be available, with pick-ups and drop-offs for those attending the event.

Having considered the application, the supporting documentation and made enquiries where appropriate, the Inspector does not oppose this application.

THE DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) grants a Class 3 On-site Licence to the Te Puke Citizens Club Inc., to enable it to facilitate an event – the Tridents Woman's Flag Football Quiz Night Fundraiser – to be held on Saturday 08th March from 5.30p.m to 10.00p.m at its premises subject to the follow conditions being applied.



The Conditions to be applied

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

Tridents Woman's Flag Football Quiz Night Fundraiser.

Saturday 08 March 2025 from 5:30 pm to 10:00 pm.

(with sales ceasing at 9:30 pm, allowing for a 30-minute drink up time)

2. **Free drinking water** is to be available to customers from the bar.
3. The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold and supplied under the licence, a reasonable range of low-alcoholic ($\leq 2.5\%$ abv) and non-alcoholic refreshments, and food appropriate to the occasion.
4. Information regarding and assistance with alternative forms of transport and a courtesy vehicle must be available.
5. For the purposes of the licence a **certified duty manager** must be appointed to manage the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
6. A maximum of 2 (standard) alcoholic drinks per person per sale is permitted.
7. The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Ensure that no intoxicated persons are allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
8. The licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signage detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises that identifies by name the certified manager on duty.
