Sections 14 to 16, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

**Pursuant** to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the **Act**), **B-O-P BREWERY LIMITED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **UNIT 6/168 ŌMOKOROA ROAD**, **ŌMOKOROA** and known as **RISING TIDE ŌMOKOROA**, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

### CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- 2. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

#### Monday to Sunday: Hours - 11:00 am to 10:00 pm

- 3. Drinking water must be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.

## THE APPLICATION

This is an application by **B-O-P BREWERY LIMITED** for an **ON LICENCE** in respect of premises situated at Shop 6, 168 Ōmokoroa Road, Ōmokoroa, known as "**Rising Tide Ōmokoroa**".

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of an **ON LICENCE - CLASS 1 RESTAURANT.** The business is a new venture, and the provision of food will be the principal source of sales revenue.

The days and hours sought are:

## Monday to Sunday 11:00 am to 10:00 pm

These hours are in line with those permitted in the Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy.

The applicant is currently operating an existing on licence for the premises under a temporary authority and is seeking a new licence on the same terms and conditions.

The application was notified in the Weekend Sun on the 13<sup>th</sup> and again on the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 2023. There have been no objections to the application received by the Secretariat. The Inspector has reported that there was a minor error in the first public notice as to the number of days that the public had to object and has recommended that a waiver pursuant to section 208 of the Act is appropriate in this case. I agree

The applicant has provided a comprehensive menu of the food options that they intend to sell and the low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments that are available mmon

The planning and building certificate pursuant to section 100(f) has been ssuedof

#### **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health have reported on the application. Pursuant to section 103(4) of the Act it is assumed that they have not matters in opposition.

The Inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the locality is unlikely to be adversely affected by more than a minor extent by the effects of the issue of the licence. The applicant company and its directors/shareholders are experienced licensees currently operating Rising Tide and Super liquor in Mount Maunganui.

However, given that this is an application for a new on-licence, it is important that the applicant understands that the first year is often called the 'probationary year' and that the regulatory agencies will be monitoring how the licence is being operated.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 & 106 of the Act.

The application is considered on the papers.

### DECISION

The District Licensing Committee, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **grants** an application by **B-O-P Brewery Limited ("the licensee")** for a new ON Licence in respect of premises situated at Shop 6, 168 Ōmokoroa Road, Ōmokoroa to be known as "Rising Tide Ōmokoroa" subject to conditions.

## The Application

PB Consulting Engineers Limited applies for the grant of an OFF Licence in respect of premises situated at 153 Lochhead Road, Te Puna, Tauranga known as "Swallow Distillery.

The business is a boutique distillery and seeks a Section 40 remote Off Licence to sell their alcohol online.

The application is deemed not opposed by the Police or the Medical Officer of Health as neither have responded with matters in opposition within the statutory timeframes.

The application was notified in the BOP Times on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of September 2023 and no objections have been received from members of the public.

A building and planning certificate has been sought and issued.

## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The application is complete and contains all the supporting documents as under s.100 of the Act.



The Police and Medical Officer of Health offer no matters in opposition.

The licensee must have a certificated manager properly appointed to the business, but, pursuant to sections 214 and 215, that manager does not need to be physically on duty at all times.

Overall, I am satisfied that the applicant will carry out the business of a remote seller of alcohol, and of the matters to which we must have regard as set out in the Act.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

No changes being sought from the existing licence are sought. There have been no matters raised in regard to the Resource Management Act. The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) applies to this application.

## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

## **THE APPLICATION**

This is an application by **Persimmon Lane Limited** for the renewal of an **ON Licence** in respect of premises situated at **58 Te Puna Road**, **Te Puna** known as **Persimmon Lane**.

The applicant is a private limited company incorporated on 21 April 2016. The general nature of the business being undertaken is that of a **ON LICENCE – OTHER PREMISES NOT OTHERWISE SPECIFIED.** 

The days and hours sought are the same as the current licence.

## Monday to Sunday 9:00 am to 10:00 pm

The hours are within the default national maximum trading hours and the Western Bay of Plenty Local Alcohol Policy. The premises were previously operated as a class 3 restaurant but are only now used as a for small meeting and events. The Inspector recommends in her report that the premises style be changed from that of a 'class 3 restaurant' to that of 'other premises not otherwise specified'. While this is a pragmatic solution to the changed style of operation, the premises will need to be monitored to ensure that they do not become a full function centre that carries a higher risk rating.

Food and beverages (including alcohol) are served to customers seated at the tables. While there is a service bar area, no customers can order/consume drinks in this area.

While no changes are being sought from the existing licence, the style of licence will be amended as discussed above. There have been no matters raised in regard to the Resource Management Act.
