#### APLTP1.6 Engagement Options for the Annual Plan 2020/21

The Committee considered a report from the Senior Financial Planner dated 10 December 2019.

The Group Manager Finance and Technology Services introduced the report, noting that a decision was sought regarding the level of community engagement considered appropriate for the Annual Plan 2020/21.

He highlighted key matters in the report, and advised that the Committee must be comfortable with its determination as to whether or not there were any significant or material differences from the content of the Long Term Plan for the 2020/21 financial year. He noted that if there were none, then Council was not required to follow the Special Consultative Procedure (SCP), i.e. to consult for the adoption of its Annual Plan.

Matters were considered under the following three lenses:

- The threshold for significance under Council's Significance and Engagement Policy;
- The Determination of materiality under the Local Government Act 2002;
- The Threshold for Long Term Plan amendment under the Local Government Act 2002.

The matters considered by the Committee were as follows:

- An analysis of budget and project changes compared to the forecast for 2020/21 in the Long Term Plan;
- Debt management topics;
- Council's water charging regime.

Staff responded to questions as follows:

- If the Committee decided on an 'informed only' approach, and then received community feedback requesting consultation, it was within Council's powers to consider such a request prior to finalising its Annual Plan in late June 2020.
- If the Committee decided on an 'informed only' approach, there would be a spectrum of engagement including a full range of options.
- Groups would always be able to approach Council on a one-on-one basis and not consulting did not remove the community's ability to approach Council.

- Depending on the Committee's decision today, an extensive Draft Communication Plan approach would be prepared, and presented to Councillors for consideration at the next Annual Plan workshop.
- Targeted rates were not subsidised. If Council wished to reduce a targeted rate, it had to extend the debt repayment period, which did not significantly reduce the debt. Infrastructure replacement must still be undertaken.
- If a rate was changed, then Council was required to consult and refer this to the Long Term Plan.
- It was envisaged that the newly established Ward Forums would have a significant role to play in terms of engaging with their communities.

Following indications from the floor, the Chairperson noted that it appeared that the Committee had discussed matters sufficiently and was in a position to make its decision. The following motion was put.

- 4. That staff prepare a Communications and Engagement Plan to give effect to resolution 3 for direction to the Annual Plan workshop scheduled on 13 February 2019.
