



Minutes of Meeting No. MC18 of the Maketu Community Board held on 19 February 2019 in the Maketu Community Centre commencing at 7.00pm

MC18.1 Presentation - Waiari Water Scheme Project

Jennifer Pearson, Howard Severinson and Monique Lints were in attendance representing the Tauranga City Council in regard to the Waiāri Water Supply Scheme project. Howard Severinson and Jennifer Pearson spoke to a presentation noting the following updates:

- The construction of the Waiāri site access was continuing
- Consultation with landowners was being undertaken with landowners at No.1 Road.
- The vegetation plan had been consulted on and completed
- Regular e-news updates and community consultation was continuing
- Fact Sheets and the pipeline map were available to the public
- Tenders for the pipeline work had gone out in October and as a result of limited response, a split tender process (for 3 separate contracts) would be undertaken being:
 - 4km of pipeline from water processing plant down No 1 Road and across Landscape Road.
 - Farm land across Te Puke Highway to Poplar lane

 Reservoir to Reservoir – 9km of pipeline to Te Puke Highway from Poplar Lane to Welcome Bay Road and along Welcome Bay Road to the eastern reservoir.

The Reservoir to Reservoir pipeline route was the first contract to be awarded and the work was expected to commence in mid-March 2019 and be completed by June 2020.

The required resource consents were being managed in consultation with the Waiari Kaitiaki Action Group and included a Mauri monitoring model, vegetation management plan and ecological monitoring. Options to improve access to the Waiāri Stream were being considered.

The Board was advised that there would be no construction work undertaken on No.1 Road during the kiwifruit season. The No.1 Road section of pipeline would be designed to decrease traffic disruption.

The community would be kept informed of the progress of the project at various local community events, by web-site and social media, YouTube, and e-news sites and local newspapers.

The Chairperson extended thanks to the presenters noting that he looked forward to the future updates on the progress of the project.

MC18.3 Chairperson's Report

The Board considered a report from the Chairperson dated 4 February 2019 as circulated with the agenda.

MC18.3.1 Sewerage System Grinder Pumps/Equipment

The Board was advised that there was not a shortage of spare grinder pumps for the Maketu Sewerage system. There was the ability to service or replace pumps on site as/when required. There was an expectation that the pumps would last for 10-15 years and the interchangeable parts had a life expectancy dependent on what had been flushed down the toilet.

MC18.3.2 Itinerant Campers / Freedom Camping

The Chairperson highlighted anti-social behaviours and there were considerable concerns regarding itinerant campers that the local community had been faced with.

The Board was advised that the Freedom Camping Bylaw would be reviewed this year and there would be an opportunity to have input into the review process.

MC18.3.3 Notice of Rahui - Okurei Point Maketu

The Board was saddened to hear of a landslip that had resulted in the displacement of on urupa on Okurei Point.

MC18.3.4 Speed Limit Review

The Board noted that with the development and completion of the planned cycleway along Maketu Road, the speed limit along the specific crossover points on the road would need to be looked at in the interest of safety for motorists and cycle and walkway users.

The Board was advised that Western Bay of Plenty District Council had aput a hold on the review of speed limits on local roads, pending direction from the New Zealand Transport Agency on its state highways.

MC18.3.5 Name Change to Stopped Portion of Te Tumu Road to Cruickshank Lane

The Board advised that the signage for Cruickshank Lane had not yet been erected. The new name for the stopped portion of Te Tumu Road (arising from the construction of the Tauranga Eastern Link) had been put forward following a Board meeting in March 2017 and adopted by the Regulatory Hearings Committee meeting held on 19 April 2017. The Board requested that the signage for Cruickshank Lane be erected as soon as possible.

MC18.3.6 Tsunami Signage

The Roading Engineer (East) advised the Board that he had been assured that the Tsunami signs directing people to the highest point in Maketu in the event of a Tsunami warning would be erected in the near future.

MC18.7 Infrastructure Services Report Maketu - February 2019

The Board considered a report from the Deputy Chief Executive dated 1 February 2019 as circulated with the agenda.

MC18.7.1 Surf Club Car Park Reserve Rock Revetment - Minute Action Reference MC20 16.2.1

The Board noted that three responses had been received, one in support of the proposal and two against. The submitters had requested a hearing. On this basis a report was to be presented to the Operations and Monitoring Committee outlining the process and potential costs that Council would incur should this matter go to another hearing and potentially the Environment Court.

The Board expressed their frustration in the time that had been taken up with the same people objecting to any advancement and improvement to the area. Repairs to the Surf Club Car Park needed to be undertaken with urgency as there were some hazardous areas of the rock revetment structure that presented specific health and safety risks.

MC18.7.2 Water Tank Face Lift - Minute Action Reference MC22 16 3.11

The Chairperson advised that he would continue to seek design and cost options from local artists.

MC18.7.3 Kohanga Reo - Minute Action Reference MC8 17 2.4

The Board was advised that there had been no acknowledgement of the letter sent to the Kohanga Reo in November 2018. The Board was advised that some metal had been put down over the pot holes at the reserve entrance next to the Kohanga Reo in October 2018.

The Board reiterated their frustration that the agreed improvements to remedy the illegal parking had not happened.

MC18.7.4 Cycleway into Maketu - Minute Action Reference MC8 17 2.4

The Board was advised that the design for the cycleway was progressing and should be available for comment by the end of February, early March 2019.

MC18.7.5 Improvements to Culvert Capacity - Spencer Avenue - Minute Action Reference MC12 18 5.2

The Board was advised that tender prices were to be received in February 2019 based on a similar outlet pipe to the existing structure with a floodgate arrangement at the end of the pipe.

The Chairperson noted that local residents were adamant that the new pipe was to improve the management of stormwater and only one of the stormwater pipes should have a fish friendly gate.

MC18.7.6 Re-Instatement of Boating Channel - Minute Action

The Board had earlier expressed their concern that the Maketu boat channel needed to be maintained in the immediate and long term. The channel needed to be accessible for all boating vessels and was 'silting up' due not being flushed out as a result of the Kaituna re-diversion work.

The Board requested that the Bay of Plenty Regional Council undertake reinstatement work in the channel before the completion of the Kaituna rediversion work.

MC18.7.7 Suggested Jetty/Pole Installation at Bell Road Boat Ramp Minute Action Reference MC16 18 7.9

The Board was advised that the Reserves and Facilities team were organising land based mooring posts to be installed by the Bell Road boat access.

MC18.7.8 Beach Road Update

The Roading Engineer (East) advised that the design work for the proposed kerb and channel work had been completed. In order to minimise costs, an Archaeological Authority application would be lodged for the Beach Road work in conjunction with the Maketu Cycleway, Arawa Avenue footpath, Williams Crescent Lookout Point and Rauporoa Road kerb and channel pending projects. The Beach Road work was expected to start in May 2019.

It was clarified that the Heritage New Zealand Act 2014 made it unlawful for any person to modify or destroy, or cause to be modified or destroyed, the whole or any part of an archaeological site without the prior authority of Heritage New Zealand. Authority from Heritage New Zealand must be obtained before any work began and Council had a responsibility to uphold this requirement.

This was required regardless of whether the land on which the site was located was designated, or the activity was permitted under the District or Regional Plan or a resource or building consent had been granted. The Act provides for substantial penalties for unauthorised destruction or modification.

Subject	Update to Community Boards on upcoming consultation

Council has adopted a range of planning, bylaw and policy projects that will be released for consultation from 18 March to 18 April 2019. These are summarised below.

Project	What it's about
Proposal to introduce kerbside rubbish and recycling services	Council has been investigating its approach to rubbish and recycling over the last couple of years. The proposal will introduce the Council-contracted delivery of kerbside rubbish and recycling services to approximately 80 percent of the District, commencing in 2021.
Annual Plan 2019/20	Key topics for the Annual Plan include Council's approach to debt management, and changes to a number of targeted rates. A proposed policy enables optional early payment for capital costs of specific infrastructure projects.
Schedule of Fees and Charges	The proposed fees and charges for Council services in 2019/20 will be open for feedback.
Traffic and Parking Enforcement Bylaw review	A review of the parking restrictions, primarily in our main town centres
Trading in Public Places Bylaw review	A review of the rules and conditions that apply to mobile traders (such as coffee carts, roadside fruit and vegetable sellers, ice cream trucks etc.)
General Bylaw review	A review of the rules and requirements in relation to Animals (excluding dogs), Council's cemeteries, Nuisances, and Public Places.
Freedom Camping Bylaw	Proposals relating to changes to freedom camping restrictions at specific sites around the District.
Gambling policies	Council's Class 4 venues and TAB venues policies will be open for consultation. The policies propose a more restrictive approach than the operative policy.

Council has produced a Consultation Document, which provides the basis for conversation with our communities. This covers the kerbside waste proposal and the Annual Plan matters. See <a href="https://hater.com/hater.

Submissions can be made online (through the above link), posted to Council or at the libraries and service centres across the District. Interested people can also request documentation to posted to them.

During the consultation period, there will be seven place-based 'have your say' events run in the across the district. The following dates, times and venues are now confirmed:

- Omokoroa Settlers Hall Sat 23 March 9am-12pm
- Oropi Hall Wed 27 March 6.30pm-8pm
- Waihi Beach RSA Sat 30 March 9am-12pm
- Te Puna Quarry Park Gallery Wed 3 April 4pm-7pm
- Te Puke Memorial Hall Sat 6 April 9am-12pm
- Maketu Community Centre Wed 10 April 4pm-7pm
- Katikati Community Hub Patuki Manawa Sat 13 April 9am-12pm

These events will act as both a drop in day (information sharing) and an opportunity to 'have your say' for the community. They replace formal hearings. Ward Councillors and Community Board members are encouraged to attend the events in their area, and may attend any other events as they wish.

Events will include a registration area and stations for the respective topics. Further information will be displayed and staff will be present to take notes on any discussion between the community and Councillors/Community Board Chairs about the proposals. This verbal feedback will also be considered through Council's decision making process about the proposals.

Community Boards may make a written submission during the consultation period, covering one or more of the projects being consulted on. If Community Boards wish to make a verbal presentation, they are invited to do this at the event in Council Chambers on 15 or 16 April. OP17.5 Makety Surf Club Car Park Erosion Protection

The Operations and Monitoring Committee considered a report from the Reserves and Facilities Projects and Asset Manager dated 12 February 2019 as circulated with the agenda.

The Reserves and Facilities Manager spoke to the report that sought direction on whether to invest financially into a hearing process.

In discussion the following points were noted:

- The Bay of Plenty Regional Council had agreed to place the Resource Consent Hearing on hold until Council provided direction on whether it wished to proceed with or withdraw the application to repair the Maketu Surf Club Car Park steps.
- Councillors from the eastern end of the Western Bay of Plenty District advised that the consent process had been held up over a long period

- of time by a small number of local representatives. The situation needed to be resolved and the steps needed to be repaired as soon as possible.
- The surf club car park steps were a community asset and there was a strong feeling within the Maketu community that the steps in their current state were an eyesore and a health and safety and needed to be repaired as soon as possible.

1.0 Utilities

1.1 Maketu Stormwater Catchment Areas

Inspections were carried out in January with spraying and mechanical clearing to follow in March and April 2019.

1.2 Comprehensive Stormwater Consents - Eastern Zone

The Catchment Management Plan for the Eastern Catchment was lodged with the Bay of Plenty Regional Council prior to Christmas. The Eastern Zone includes the urban areas of Maketu, Te Puke, Pukehina and Paengaroa. The plan will form the basis for the Comprehensive Stormwater Consent Application. Consultation with the community was held on the Catchment Management Plan prior to it being lodged. Positive feedback was received. This application is currently being processed by the Bay of Plenty Regional Council.

2.1 Dotterel Point Reserve Capital Development (Pukehina)

There has been little change since the previous report. The monitoring of the upgraded septic tank system will remain ongoing and likely to remain this way until the Surf Club begin construction of their new facilities, the timing of which is subject to their funding being secured.

Resolution The Board was advised that the required Resource Consent was currently on hold due to objections to the proposed channel dredging associated with nourishment and improving

navigable access from the boat ramp at Park Road.

Further consideration was required to understand the concerns from Tangata Whenua.

The Board requested that the option to remove the channel dredging component from the Resource Consent application so that it (future channel dredging) may be considered as a separate matter in the future.

It was also noted that repairs and safety improvements to the rock revetment needed to be undertaken as soon as possible as there were now some hazardous areas of the structure that presented specific health and safety risk issues.

Actions

1 March 2019: At its meeting held on 28 February 2019, the Operations & Monitoring Committee resolved to proceed to a hearing with the Regional Council.

Staff have advised the Regional Council of this decision. A hearing date has yet to be set.

31 Jan 2019: Bay of Plenty Regional Council have sought a limited notification process on this Resource Consent Application with specific iwi/hapu.

Three responses have been received, one in support of the proposal and two against. The submitters have requested a hearing. On this basis, a report will be presented to the Operations & Monitoring Committee outlining the process and potential costs that Council would incur should the matter go to another hearing and potentially the Environment Court. The Board will be advised of the outcome.

12 Nov 2018: There has been little change since the previous update. Staff are waiting for a response from BoPRC regarding a suggested way forward with the Resource Consent application.

- 1 Oct 2018: Staff continue to work with the Regional Council on the issue of Limited Notification. WBOPDC will need to consider whether or not if it continues to a hearing stage, following the Limited Notification process, as a hearing process would be costly and has the potential to go to the Environmental Court.
- 17 August 2018: There has been no significant change. The Regional Council is assessing navigation issues given the expected increase in boat usage at Park Road Boat Ramp.

6 July 2018: Council is still working through the requirement for limited notification with BOPRC.

25 May 2018: The Regional Council has sent the application to a Christchurch based consultant for processing.

The Consultant has recommended that the Consent be processed as a Limited Notification Consent as there have been objections from several local hapu representatives.

Council's consultant is meeting with BoPRC to challenge the need for a Limited Notification.

- 16 April 2018: Bay of Plenty Regional Council are processing the Resource Consent. There have been no requests for further information.
- 13 March 2018: Tangata whenua consultation for the revised resource consent application has been held on site. Feedback from Ngati Whakaue was positive and feedback from Ngati Pikiau was not. The responses have since been forwarded to BOPRC for consideration and processing of the RC application.
- 5 Feb 2018: Council's consultant and staff have been working with local hapu on various issues they have raised.

Once a position is reached, the revised application will be re-submitted to the Regional Council.

16 January 2018: A revised "Assessment of Environmental Effects" report has been drafted, which excludes the originally proposed channel dredging.

Before this revised application is lodged, a Hui is being organized to present the revised application and conclude feedback.

A date for the Hui is likely to be late February.

It is noted that the recent storm surge event of 5 January has lowered the beach level in this location, further exposing the car park foundations; however, there is no increase of risk to the structure at this stage.

- 6 Dec 2017: Noted that the preference by the Board is to remove the proposed boat ramp channel dredging from the Resource Consent application. The draft Resource Consent application will be edited accordingly and a meeting will be arranged to meet with Tangata Whenua early in 2018 to discs the application.
- 14 Nov 2017: Staff are reviewing the site to ensure any hazards are mitigated. The channel dredging component of the consent application is to be removed at this point in time.
- 27 Oct 2017: There has been no change from the previous update in September as there has been no further consultation with Tangata Whenua. The Board may wish to comment on the current status as per the previous update.
- 11 Sept 2017: Resource Consent is processing is currently on hold due to objections to the proposed channel dredging associated with beach nourishment and improving navigable access from the boat ramp at Park Road.

Further consultation is required to understand the concerns from Tangata Whenua. Other options to consider include:

- Removing the channel dredging component from the Resource Consent application so that it may be considered as a separate matter in the future OR
 - Withdrawal of the application in its entirety. This means that planned future remedial reconstruction to the Surf Club car park seal wall will not occur and nature will determine the future of the asset.

9 August 2017: No change from the previous report as we are waiting for the Resource Consent application to be processed.

28 July 2017: No change from the previous update because consent application has been lodged.

3 July 2017: The Board has acknowledged (remit MC517 6.3) that other projects have been taking priority over this one and that project risk from time delay is low. Note that this consent application is also seeking approval for future minor dredging of sand adjacent the Park Rd Boat ramp for the purposes of both improving navigable access to the ramp and as a sand resource for beach nourishment in front of the Surf Club carpark revetment. The area of dredging proposed (which was consulted with the Board Chairman), indicated below.



22 May 2017: No change from last month's update. The Resource Consent application process is under action by the consultant, noting that other projects have been taking priority over this one. Project risk from time delay is low.

24 April 2017: Detailed design plans and resource consent application for the erosion protection concrete steps, are being prepared by the consultant and will be submitted to BOPRC in due course. The current focus is on upgrading the Omokoroa and Opuereroa Boat Ramp for the new larger barge / ferry, which is due in June/July 2017.

9 February 2017: Detailed design plans and resource consent application for erosion protection concrete steps are being prepared by the consultant and will be submitted to BOPRC in due course.

12/1/2017: A revised concept design draft for the preferred concrete steps option was distributed to stakeholders (Community Board, Tangata whenua, Surf Club) for feedback by 16 December.

The only feedback received was from Ngati Pikiao Hapu. Detailed design and a resource consent application is now being prepared for submission to the BOP Regional Council. Construction timing dependent on the consent process, construction pricing and budget.

8/12/2016: The revised Maketu Surf Club carpark seawall design based on the preferred option has been distributed to all stakeholders for feedback before detailed design and resource consent application process is undertaken.

17/11/2016: A revised concept design draft for the preferred concrete steps option has now been completed and will be distributed to stakeholders (Community Board, Tangata whenua, Surf Club) for feedback. Feedback and a price estimate will inform the final design which will then be priced and construction works scheduled from there, subject to consenting processes.

14/10/2016: Preferred concrete design and pricing underway which will be presented to the Board and Tangata whenua when available.

14/9/2016: The preferred concrete steps option has been referred back to the consultant for detailed design and construction price estimation. The Board, Tanagta whenua and community will be provided a copy of the detailed design to confirm as soon as it becomes available.

12/8/2016: assessment report was presented to Tangata whenua with the preferred option identified to extend the concrete steps down below beach level. The Community have recently agreed with this so on that basis, staff will now proceed with detailed design, pricing and consenting processes. Timing of works will depend on consenting process and cost. Construction is unlikely to occur before Christmas.

13/7/2016: Erosion assessment report is being present to the Maketu Community on the 14th July. Feedback from this meeting will inform the preferred option/resource consent and detailed design. The Board received the Safety Review on the Cycleway into Maketu from the Westlink Senior Transportation and Safety Engineer and noted that Option 1 Alignment along the estuary side of Maketu Road was the preferred option indicated by the Deputy Chief Executive.

The Chairperson and Board members expressed their frustration in regard to the indicated route for the proposed cycleway into Maketu as they felt that none of their input had been given proper consideration.

The Chairperson noted the following points:

- A meeting had been held with residents (along the proposed route) and a Council staff member some 12 months ago and nothing had been heard from Council since
- It was the opinion of the Board that the Safety Review should have been done by an independent contractor not a Westlink staff member.
- The Safety Review had been done without a visit to the proposed site.
- The points raised by the community had not been listened to and the recommendation relating to the options were against what the community wanted.

Board Members had spoken to immediate residents along the route, cycling groups who regularly used the roadway, members of the Maketu Projects Team and locals who were clear that they did not want the cycleway to be on the left hand side of the roadway coming into Maketu.

The Board Chairperson summarised road accident numbers reported over the past seven years along Maketu Road.

The Board and the community at large were very much in favour of the cycleway and wanted to see it completed as soon as possible. The Board would like a meeting to be organised with Board members, Council staff and affected residents, local cyclists and the author of the safety assessment report in order to ensure that an informative and consultative process was undertaken in regard to the future route for the Maketu Road cycleway.

The Reserves and Facilities Manager advised that he would provide the Board's feedback to the Deputy Chief Executive with a suggestion that a meeting be held in the new year to review the safety assessment and proposed options.

5 March 2019: The detailed design is not yet complete.

24 Jan 2019: WestLink design progressing well. Detailed design should be available for community to comment by end of February – to mid March.

5 Nov 2018: An additional survey has been undertaken to assist the design.

2 Oct 2018: The design review and estimate is underway and will be advise to the Board once complete.

20 August 2018: Staff and Councillor Marsh met the landowner on 10 August to discuss options to construct the cycleway partly over private property. This was unsuccessful.

Actions

The cycleway alignment will be designed and estimated based on three options:

- a) Wetlands side Maketu to Kaituna Road
- b) Estuary side Maketu to Kaituna Road (previously designed and estimated)
- Wetland side from Maketu to a crossing point with good visibility then coastal side to Kaituna Road.

The options and estimate will be reported back to the Board when completed.

26 June 2018: A meeting is being arranged with Councillor Marsh, staff and the landowner.

16 May 2018: The plan for the private land requirement has been provided to Councillor Marsh, who will contact the owner.

9 April 2018: Board Members, staff and members of the public met on site on 16 March to discuss options relating to the route for the proposed cycleway into Maketu.

The Reserves and Facilities Manager advised that it had been agreed to fully cost the cycleway route along the eastern side (wetland side - right-hand side) of the roadway into Maketu.

The Chairperson noted that the site meeting was very positive and the decision to locate the proposed cycleway into Maketu on the right-hand side of the roadway into Maketu had been unanimously supported.

- Budget Funding May require to be included in Annual Plan process. (Dependent on transportation budget availability).
- May also require consent in relation to excavation and Heritage NZ.
- Road closure notice required as part of Traffic Management Plan.
- Timing of works dependent on number of items above.

Regards to MAS MC1819 7.5 The Chairperson noted that local residents were adamant that the new pipe was to improve the management of stormwater and only one of the stormwater pipes should have a fish friendly gate.

Noted. Bay of Plenty Regional Council are responsible for making this recommendation.

24 Jan 2019: Tender prices to be received in February 2019 based in a similar sized outlet pipe to existing with flood gate arrangement to end of pipe.

29 Oct 2018: The Utilities Manager has met with BoPRC Pim de Monchy.

Discussion held with BoPRC Pim de Monchy in late October with agreement reached to install a second culvert pipe with a floodgate.

Tender prices are being sought for works. The expected timeframe for completion is Jan-Feb 2019.

The works to be part of a comprehensive stormwater consent process.

Funding of \$30k from BoPRC and the balance funded by WBoPDC.

The design is underway and is being managed in-house, staff are managing the works.

1 Oct 2018: Staff have arranged a meeting with Bay of Plenty Regional Council to progress an option for a second culvert pipe of similar size to the existing culvert with a flood gate. A detailed plan and costing will be prepared for consideration and arrangement of funding.
