1. Contract Overview

WestLink's new Contract Manager (Paul Howard) is on board now full time and a number of other positions have been filled.

The annual Performance Workshop has been scheduled for mid April.

The Performance Workshop covers such areas as:

- Performance framework results from the previous year
- Challenges and performance expectations going forward
- Refresh the partnering charter
- Provide all participants with information about the outcome performance measures
- Any major Contract Plan or policy changes
- · Confirm and reinforce alignment with principal's strategic direction.

2. Operational Performance Measures

Operational Performance Measures (OPMs) reflect the day-to-day levels of service required under the ONMC. WestLink's performance is measured on a monthly basis and if a prescribed maximum compliance score is exceeded the Contractor will have money deducted from their monthly payment.

The previous eight months scores are as follows:


Overall WestLink are generally achieving good OPM outcomes however there have been eight proportional adjustments for Council over the last 12 months. Deductions have ranged from \$15 to \$3,960.


February was the first time in the Contract that WestLink's State Highway OPM Score has exceeded the maximum monthly compliance score of 21. The monthly score achieved was 26 resulting in an at-risk deduction of \$3,731.12.

The high score was primarily related to breaching vegetation related OPMs. Wet and warm conditions have promoted significant growth this summer.

4. Works Programme

The current Capital Works Programme is attached but is not fully up to date.

4.1 Seal Extensions

The Matakana Road seal extension is the last of the lump sum projects. Metal had previously been barged and stockpiled on the island and work commenced early in March.

Work on the Wright Road seal extension also started in March.

The Taumata Road seal extension was completed prior to Christmas.

Council have still yet to review a formal priced offer for the additional seal extensions.

4.2 Rehabilitation/Renewals

The pavement rehabilitation on Welcome Bay Road between Water Lane and Waitao Road is complete. The section adjacent to the Addline Transport depot is programmed for the 2018/19 construction season.

A small section of rehabilitation on Tainui Road is complete.

The scope of the pavement rehabilitation on Omokoroa Road between Western Avenue and Tralee Street has been expanded to include kerb and channel and bus stops thus requiring additional design. Construction is now not likely until the 2018/19 construction season.

Rehabilitation on Poripori Road is still in the planning stage however the proposed widening has still not been confirmed.

Design of the Maungarangi Road rehabilitation is complete and iwi concerns seem to have been addressed however construction has yet to be programmed.

The following roads are being investigated, designed or priced for rehabilitation and some include widening:

- Pukemapu
- Rangiuru
- Maniatutu Road Rehabilitation and Widening
- Te Matai Road Rehabilitation and Widening
- Oropi Road realignment 4970-5180

4.3 Te Puke Highway Renewals

Sheet piling has been accepted as the solution for the preventative maintenance project on the Kaituna River adjacent to Pah Road. Final approval for the design is currently sitting with BoPRC.

The pavement rehabilitation through Waitangi and guardrail reinstatement at Rangiuru are now complete.

Design for emergency reinstatement of slips on Mystery Valley, Ford Road, Soldiers Road and Stockton Road is still in progress.

4.5 Unsealed Roads - Surface Defect Index

A total length of 10.09km (21 sections) of unsealed rating was completed in February 2018 based on road lengths provided by West Roads.

Based on the specified method of measurement, 11 individual sections exceeded the KPM thresholds. Defects in these sections will need to be addressed within the next two months.

The volume of unsealed road metal applied to date in the contract is behind the minimum cumulative quantity offered by WestLink in their tender. WestLink have indicated that they would review the situation and target the application of additional material as required and this process has now commenced.

5 Miscellaneous

The footpath repair programme is continuing in smaller communities including Maketu, Pukehina and Paengaroa.

The Omokoroa Road realignment has been delayed due to the requirement to remove some sections of A/C pipe. Bulk earthworks can now be completed and basecourse is being laid in March.

The SH36/Oropi Gorge Intersection underslip reinstatement using sheet piling is essentially complete.







The Chairperson advised that the NZ Transport Agency representative, Adam Francis had been seconded to a national role and would not be a part of the committee for the rest of the year. She thanked him for his service in his previous role at the NZ Transport Agency and for his contribution to the Joint Road Safety Committee.

Apologies

Apologies for absence were received from Jessica Davis (Accident Compensation Corporation), Jenny Mack (Bay of Plenty Regional Council) and Martin Parkes (Tauranga City Council).

The Chairperson introduced Inspector Clifford Paxton to the Committee and invited him to introduce himself. He advised of his background in the Police and his previous experience in road safety during his career.

JRS5.1 Minutes of Meeting No. JRS4 of the Joint Road Safety Committee

The Committee considered the minutes of JRS4 of the Joint Road Safety Committee meeting held on 21 November 2017 as circulated with the agenda.

Resolved: Councillors Grainger / Murray-Benge

THAT the minutes of Meeting No. JRS4 of the Joint Road Safety Committee held on 21 November 2017 as circulated with the agenda be confirmed as a true and correct record.

JRS5.2 Western Bay Joint Road Safety Operations Meeting Minutes

As there were no meetings of the Western Bay Joint Road Safety Operations Committee since the last meeting of this committee, there were no new minutes to receive.

JRS5.3 New Zealand Police Report

The Committee considered a report from the New Zealand Police dated 8 February 2018 as circulated with the agenda.

Acting Senior Sergeant Hunter advised that since the report had been written a second fatality had occurred involving a mobility scooter. He also advised that he had amended the NZ Police report to provide more context to the incidents that were reported.

The Committee discussed State Highway Two North and the issues in some areas on this road. It was surmised that the majority of issues on this road where attributed to driver behaviour rather than issues with the road itself but, when mistakes occurred or drivers were distracted, the road was very unforgiving, and the outcome was serious injury. It was also discussed that intersections on both State Highway Two and 29 were not safe for various reasons and needed attention.

The Bay of Plenty Regional Land Transport Plan 2018 was referenced during this discussion and it was noted that no information had been included in this document about projects pertaining to roads of significance, as it was believed State Highway Two North was. The NZ Transport Agency representative advised that the State Highway Two North project would be started from the Waihi Beach end and work towards Tauranga and that the project process required adherence to legal processes including consent that started at the end of last year.

In response to a question regarding Loop Road, the NZ Transport Agency representative advised that the work for this was programmed for some time in 2021. He also explained that, while the project was being worked on, the NZ Transport Agency was working to mitigate some of the problem areas and intersections on State Highway Two North to decrease hazards and risk of serious injury until the projected works had been completed. He advised he could provide further information about the project to the Committee.

In response to a question, Acting Senior Sergeant Hunter advised that the Te Puna roundabout had made some great improvements to safety in the area. He reported that traffic safety campaigns in the area had revealed that those who were caught in traffic in the area would start using their cell phones while they were waiting and held up traffic because they were not paying attention when traffic was able to move.

Acting Senior Sergeant Hunter also spoke about Operation Kiddi-click, which involved the stopping of cars with car seats and those car seats being checked for compliance by Plunket technicians. He advised that Plunket was no longer funding this project and thanked the Travel Safe Programme Leader who had helped secure funding for the most recent operation.

JRS5.4 Accident Compensation Corporation Update

The Committee considered a report from the Accident Compensation Corporation dated 16 February 2018 as circulated with the agenda. The Accident Compensation Corporation representative was unavailable for the meeting and was not able to speak to her report but had noted the she had been reappointed to her position and would continue as the Accident Compensation Corporation representative on this Committee.

In response to a question about "born-again motorcycle riders" Acting Senior Sergeant Hunter advised that many of these drivers had to relearn how to ride their motorbikes after having ridden in their youth. A suggestion was made that the licencing of these motorcycle riders be reviewed and be made more stringent. The Travel Safe Programme Leader of the Tauranga City Council advised of the voluntary programmes that were currently available for motorcycle riders and there was some discussion around whether these programmes needed to be made mandatory.

JRS5.5 Travel Safe Road Safety Action Plan Report

The Committee considered a report from the Travel Safe Programme Leader of the Tauranga City Council dated 19 February 2018 as circulated with the agenda. The Travel Safe Programme Leader spoke to her report and to a revolving presentation that had been playing during the meeting of the banners that had been created by local schools for Orange Day 2017.

The Chairperson commended those who were involved in Orange Day. The Travel Safe Programme Leader explained the process the students went through to create the banners and explained that they were advertised in the community.

The Travel Safe Programme Leader updated the Committee on how the Travel Safe Programmes were tracking for the year and surmised the emerging issues that had been noted, drawing particular attention to the safety issues faced by mobility scooter users.

Councillor von Dadelszen advised that, as part of the Te Aranui Youth Trust, he was disappointed that their expo was no longer funded by Travel Safe. The Travel Safe Programme Leader advised that the decision to not fund the expo was a difficult one and explained that funding from the Travel Safe Programme was allocated based on a best practice model.

Acting Senior Sergeant Hunter tabled a document featuring a model of mobility scooter to illustrate the scope and capability of mobility scooters available particularly those that could be used on the roads, which cause safety issues for other drivers sharing the roads with them.

JRS5.6 Transport Agency Update

The Committee considered a report from the NZ Transport Agency Representative and dated 16 February 2018 as circulated with the agenda.

The NZ Transport Agency Representative explained the origins of his new role within the NZ Transport Agency and advised his new role would require him to assess speed management in some of the areas in New Zealand that had been identified as the most unsafe and apply the recently developed speed management guidelines to these areas. He also advised of a summit that would be help on 9 April 2018, which would involve discussions at a national level about road safety. The Deputy Chief Executive of the Western Bay of Plenty District Council advised that the Mayor, Chief Executive Officer and he would be attending the summit. The Chairperson advised she would be unavailable.

The NZ Transport Agency Representative introduced Alex Jeffcoat from BECA who had been seconded into Mr Francis' previous role and advised that either Mr Jeffcoat or Marceli Davison, who was now based in Tauranga, would be attending Committee meetings in his place for the rest of the year. He explained he would still be based in Tauranga and was still contactable by Committee members as required.

There was discussion that road safety should be dealt with at a local rather than a national level and that regional groups needed to be allocated larger budgets so they could look after their areas more effectively.

In relation to Belk Road, the NZ Transport Agency Representative advised that the project had evolved along with the Tauriko Business Case. He explained that the Regional Council had engaged a consultant to help with the process. Due to a specific interpretation of legislation, it had been surmised that the profile of the highway in the area acted like a dam, therefore designating the road as a structure. The NZ Transport Agency Representative advised that discussion was ongoing and the Committee would be advised of the conversation.

In his report, the NZ Transport Agency Representative drew the Committees attention to the Low Cost, Low Risk projects listed on page 50 of the agenda and asked for feedback as to the priority of the projects. It was agreed that the Poripori Road and Pongakawa Station Road projects should be given the highest priority.

It was suggested that those who use State Highway Two North regularly would benefit from a clear message about the nature of the road and that they must pay attention while doing so. It was further suggested that the organisers of the Omokoroa Future Focus meetings could be approached by the Committee to make a presentation at the next meeting to advise them when proposed improvements would likely take place and to advise the community of best practice until those changes are able to be made.

In response to questions, the NZ Transport Agency Representative explained:

- The Safer Journeys Risk Assessment Tool had been developed and informed by a lot of information including the level of risk on roads and the road side hazards, assessment of what the safe and appropriate speed limit should be and what the speed limit currently was. Travel speed data from Tomtom was used to calculate the average speed on each road. The NZ Transport Agency used this information to design roads so that drivers would naturally slow down when required and to make sure that if drivers made a mistake, that they were not fatally or seriously injured.
- There had been police support for the reduction of speeds where necessary. Area Commander Inspector Paxton confirmed this.
- The knock on effect of reduced speeds for local businesses and industries had been taken into consideration when making recommendations to reduce speed.
