

Renewal of On Licence

Sections 14 to 16, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **DHRUVI HARISH & CO LIMITED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **68 PUKEHINA PARADE, PUKEHINA** and known as **PUKEHINA BEACH STORE & TAKEAWAY**, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not:
 - a. Present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may only be sold on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday: Hours: 9.00 am to 9.00 pm.
3. Free drinking water is to be always available to customers from the water supply prominently displayed on the premises.
4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
5. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all time when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages;
6. The Licensee must provide information, advice, and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises;
7. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
8. The licensee must display at every point of sale sign detailing the restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
9. The Licensee must display at the home base premises:
 - a. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol.
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance.
 - c. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.


DURATION

The Application

The applicant, Dhruri Harish & Co Limited, is a private limited company incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 9 December 2015.

The business has been trading at this premises situated at 68 Pukehina Parade since 14 October 2016 as a store and takeaway business. Its current Licence Renon/6946/2017 has a 14th October 2020.

The two directors of the company are Vinaykamar Harishbhai Patel and Dakshaben Khandubhai Patel.

The Days and hours sought:

MONDAY TO SUNDAY

09:00a.m.

to 10:30p.m.

No changes from the existing licence is sought.

The premises is situated at 68 Pukehina Parade, Pukehina. The licensed aspect of the building is a separate café, but the building also contains a dairy and a food take-away service also owned and operated by the same business.

The building has three entrances, one for the café, one for the takeaway service and one for the dairy. The principal entrance to the café is accessed from the pavement,

The principal business is providing meals, rather than the sale of alcohol, therefore no designated areas are required. The only exception is when a local fundraising club that uses the café as its base on a Friday evening. The cafe has several tables and chairs within the cafe and has no features that could be regarded or used as a bar. Food is delivered to the tables from the kitchen. Additional ready-to-eat food can be located in the food cabinet, such as cakes. Alcohol is delivered to the table.

All the alcohol is kept behind the counter in a fridge. The licensed area encompasses the entire café and the decked area adjacent to the entrance of the café.

The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) applies to this application.

Reasons For The Decision

The Police when reporting on the application on 27th September 2020 did not oppose the application.

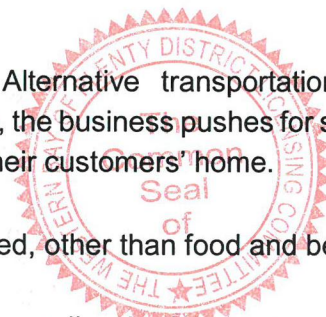
The Medical Officer of Health reported on the application on 16 November 2020. That report does not oppose the application.

Neither does New Zealand Fire Service opposed the application.

The application was publicly notified in the Te Puke Times on 1st Oct and no public objections were received.

The Inspector does not oppose this application reporting that:

- There have been no matters raised in regard to the Building Code or the Resource Management Act. The only information brought to light is the planning certificate from 2016, which stipulates the café can only sell alcohol up until 9.00 pm.
- When visiting the premise, he observed all the required signage was clearly displayed. The duty manager's name was prominently displayed above the doorway. The duty manager was present on the premises. Food menus were clearly displayed on a blackboard above the serving counter. Non-alcoholic beverages were available in a fridge behind the serving counter. Free water was also available from the fridge as was the alcohol and low alcoholic beverages. The host responsibility policy was displayed, adjacent to the licence. The on licence was displayed on the wall and visible from the entrance.
- A check of the documentation indicated the licensee did keep the manager register up to date and it was displayed on the wall. Advice was given on ensuring it was kept up to date.
- Currently there are two qualified duty managers recorded as working for the venue. The
- importance of the host responsibility policy was emphasised. The duty manager register was sighted and displayed in the kitchen.
- The applicant appears to have appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law.
- Taxis are available, but from Papamoa. Alternative transportation had been considered; but as there is no local taxi service, the business pushes for sober drivers, in a worse-case scenario the directors drive their customers' home.
- There were no other goods or services provided, other than food and beverages.
- Pukehina is a small seasonal community, expanding in the summer months with holiday makers and people using their second home to enjoy time with their families by the beach. The area is popular with freedom campers.
- There are no liquor bans in the local vicinity.



- The closest licensed premises is the Hippy Pipi, a tavern further down Pukehina Parade. In terms of shops and services, the Hippy Pipi and the dairy provide all the local grocery items to the local residents. Because of the high real estate value there are a number of real estate companies stationed along Pukehina Parade. The local area is zoned as commercial under the district plan.
- Residential housing is along the same street, however directly next door and across the road are two real estate businesses.
- To date no complaints regarding any problems originating from the café have been received. The outside of the premises is well kept and clean. The inside of the premises is also clean and tidy. There is no evidence to suggest the amenity and good order of Pukehina has suffered due to the operations of the café selling alcohol.
- He is not aware of any concerns relating to noise, nuisance or vandalism associated with the venue. Nor is there is no information to suggest the premises are associated with criminal behaviour.
- He has no reason to believe the amenity and good order of the locality would likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

The Inspector, after inquiring into the application, and based on the information provided, reports that the application meets the criteria in the Act. Subject to no new or contrary evidence being presented, the inspector does not oppose this application.

The hours comply with the requirements of the Local Alcohol Policy, as it applies to the premises.

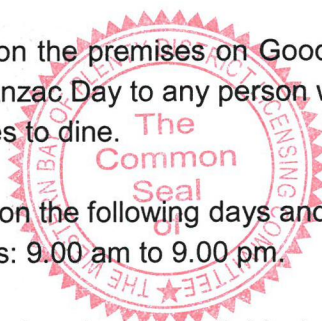

The Application

This is an application submitted by **GRADUATE TRADING LIMITED** for an **OFF LICENCE** in respect of premises situated at **76 MAIN ROAD, KATIKATI**, known as **THE BOTTLE-O KATIKATI** for a renewal of an off Licence. Its current licence 022/Renoff/6995/2017 has a 4th November Expiry date.

The general nature of the business undertaken is that of a **OFF LICENCE - BOTTLE STORE**, the principal entrance of which is accessed from the pavement outside 76 Main Road, Katikati.

Days and hours sought are Monday to Sunday 08.00a.m. to 10.00p.m.

The applicant is a limited private company (Co registration 4480823 incorporated 10 June 2013) trading since 4 November 2013. This is the applicant's third renewal application.

The applicant seeks no changes to the current licence.

Therefore the criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) applies to this application.

The Reasons for the Decision

Police reported on the application on 23 October 2020. That report does not oppose the application.

The Medical Officer of Health reported on the application on 12 October 2020. That report does not oppose the application.

New Zealand Fire Service does not oppose this application.

The application was publicly notified in Katikati Advertiser:

- First Notice 15 October 2020
- Second Notice 20 October 2020
- The objection period expired on: 6 November 2020



The Inspector does not oppose this application reporting that:

- Based on the information provided in the application and an inspection of the premises, he considers the applicant's proposal for the sale and supply of alcohol is consistent with the purpose of the Act and meets the criteria under section 131 of the Act.
- An off-licence may be renewed for this kind of premises because it meets the description found at section 32(1) (b) of the Act.
- The applicant has provided annual sales figures that indicate that 88.66% of the annual sales revenue is derived from the sale of alcohol.
- A general discussion was had with the duty manager on 22 October 2020 during an inspection of the premises. The duty manager appeared to be aware of the responsibilities under the Act. There are no concerns with the applicant's suitability.
- No adverse information has come to light regarding the operation of the premises over the last renewal period. No concerns have been reported from the agencies regarding the operation and/or conduct of the premises or the directors.
- No information has come to light to indicate the sale or supply of alcohol has not been managed appropriately or for that matter how the applicant has displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.
- There have been no issues raised in regard to the Building Code or the Resource Management Act.
- The premises consist of one large rectangular room with a walk-in refrigerated beer chiller on the left-hand side of the premises. Products are situated around the walls and behind the counter. The checkout is situated on the right-hand side as customers enter the store and provides ample coverage of the store and a good view outside to see who might be entering the premises. The area to where the public have access, being the main shop and the chiller room is the licensed area. There is no need to licence the storage areas or office. The premises is a bottle store where the principal business is selling alcohol. The applicant has requested the licensed area is designated as supervised. The presence of a duty manager is mandatory to ensure no person is sold alcohol who is either intoxicated or cannot prove their age when required to do so. The risk of any prohibited person being sold alcohol, simply boils down to the quality of the duty manager present at the time. Thereby he has no concerns with the design and layout of the premises. All required signage was clearly displayed and a manager was on duty when the premises were inspected. There were no concerns with any promotions. There appeared to be sufficient levels of staff to manage the premises effectively. The applicant appears to have appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law. Apart from alcohol, the bottle store also sells cigarettes, tobacco, soft drinks, party drinking items, potato chips and utensils.
- The premises is situated within a small hub of retail outlets set back from the main road. This area is zoned as commercial under the district plan. The local area is subject to an alcohol ban by-law, meaning no alcohol can be consumed within the liquor ban zone, which encompasses the majority of Katikati. Apart from finding a few empty cans in a local park bin, no reports of anyone breaching liquor ban in Katikati have been received.
- He is not aware any concerns relating to noise, nuisance or vandalism relating to the store under the control of the current applicant and there have been no concerns over the last

three years to indicate the operation of the premises has been the cause of any concern with respect to amenity and good order.

- The premises are well kept and has a tidy appearance within the store and from the outside. There are no negative reports from the police and no visual signs of crime in the local vicinity. There is no information to suggest the premises are associated with criminal behaviour. There is no reason to believe the amenity and good order of the locality would likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

- The club is situated approximately 100 metres from the nearest property boundaries. Noise will not be excessive. The closest property is approximately 100 meters from the club house. The club house overlooks the Tauranga harbour.
